Leah is an accomplished leader who brings extensive experience in the non-profit sector and demonstrated success in strategic fundraising. Leah will join the museum in 2023.

Our Board of Directors is thrilled to welcome Leah as Nutrien Wonderhub’s new CEO. said board chair, Sheryl Fox. “Leah is a dynamic and accomplished leader with the qualifications and expertise to grow the museum and inspire positive change.”

Born in Saskatoon, Leah holds a bachelor of science (marketing) from the University of Utah. Over the past 13 years, she has served in leadership and fundraising roles at the Royal University Hospital Foundation, the College of Arts and Science at the University of Saskatchewan, and the MacKenzie Art Gallery (Regina) where she was instrumental in securing a \$25 million gift that continues to transform the gallery. Leah’s considerable experience and passion for museums and philanthropy will be integral to her work with Nutrien Wonderhub.

“I admire the way Nutrien Wonderhub has quickly established itself as a beloved destination and resource within our community. As a children’s museum, Wonderhub’s exceptional spaces and programming create endless opportunities for exploration, discovery, and playful learning. Leah assumes the role from Dr. Anne Neufeld, who has served as the museum’s interim CEO since June of 2022. The board is grateful to Dr. Neufeld for her leadership during this interim period.

In 2019, Nutrien Wonderhub opened to the public in its new location within the iconic Mendel building along the banks of the South Saskatchewan River. Following a successful opening with strong visitation numbers, the museum had to temporarily close its doors and offer virtual programming due to the pandemic. The museum is now fully re-opened and in a strong position to welcome its new leader on board.

“This is an exciting moment in time to join Nutrien Wonderhub and I look forward to working with the board, staff, volunteers, and community stakeholders to build on the organization’s impactful work,” said Leah. “I am particularly excited to lead during the museum’s next phase of growth, ensuring we continue to find new and innovative ways to welcome, delight, and inspire all visitors.”



Leah's appointment concludes an in-depth search process completed by a search committee of the Board. "It was apparent to the committee and the Board that Leah's leadership skills, business acumen and experience in the non-profit sector are well aligned with Wonderhub," said Fox. "As we look to the future, we are confident Leah is right person to lead the museum."
